

ÉCHEZEAUX Grand Cru



The first trace of "Echezeaux" goes back to 1287. It is a derivative of the Latin word meaning 'buildings' indicating the presence of Gallo-Roman ruins. In 1353, The Abbey of Citeaux exchanged 17 ouvrées near the vineyards which they owned in Chambolle for 14 ouvrées which they already owned in "Echeseau". In addition to the 17 ouvrées, they paid 3 pounds. The soil is very deep and very rich, composed of gravel and silt.
