Bleasdale Vineyards Verdelho Langhorne Creek 2007 - Light straw colored with a lovely bouquet of fresh herbs, honeysuckle, and citrus. That leads to a medium-bodied wine exhibiting melon and tropical flavors, excellent acidity, a supple texture, and a pure, fruit filled finish. Drink it over the next 1-2 years with shellfish or roast chicken.

Bleasdale Vineyards Mulberry Tree Cabernet Sauvignon 2005 - Dark ruby colored, the wine has an aromatic array of cedar, red and black currants with a touch of eucalyptus and blackberry liqueur. This leads to a medium-to full-bodied wine with forward red and black fruit flavors, excellent balance, ripe tannins and a long, pure finish. Drink this outstanding value over the next 6 years.

Bleasdale Vineyards Shiraz Cabernet Sauvignon 2005 - Purple in color, it reveals scents of cedar, tobacco, blackcurrants and blueberry. In the mouth it is supple-textured with black berry flavors and a bit of mint in the background. This nicely balanced effort has very good depth and length. Drink this excellent value over the next 3-4 years.

Bleasdale Vineyards Frank Potts Blend 2005 - This purple colored wine exhibits an expressive nose of plum, black currant, black cherry and blackberry. It is more structured than the other wines in the portfolio but the tannins are ripe, the fruit sweet, and there is a lengthy, fruit filled finish. It will evolve for 2-3 years and drink well through 2020.
